
My Life Is In His Blood





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Study Number: 157

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My plea: It is my hope and prayer that you are searching for the truth that is contained in God's word, the Bible. My desire is to help you understand and obey these truths God has revealed in the pages of His word. It is to that end that I write this material. Please observe all of the Scripture references and evaluate whether the conclusions I have drawn are in harmony with God's word. If they are, I ask that you make honest application of those truths to your life and obey God's instructions.

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My Life Is In His Blood

How can I possibly be saved from the sins that I have committed? Romans 3:23 teaches us plainly that all have sinned and fallen short of glorifying God. Sin is acting against or contrary to the instructions of God, given in the pages of His word. In doing so, I have separated myself from all of the spiritual blessings God has made available to me and I stand doomed to experience eternal punishment. Even if I determined never to sin again, I could not be saved from the consequences of my sins. I am entirely hopeless!

This is the reality of my situation (and the situation of everyone who is living or who has lived on this earth who has committed sin) without Jesus Christ. Specifically, we need to consider the blood of Jesus Christ. For, the blood of Jesus Christ was special and has the power to give everyone who comes to God eternal salvation from their sins. Thus, Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."

In this lesson, I want you to consider how much Jesus' blood has made available for you. But, please recognize that God does require that you be obedient to His commandments in order to access the blood of Christ. Hebrews 5:9 says that Jesus Christ became "the author of eternal salvation to all who obey Him." God has required that you hear His word (Romans 10:17), believe in Jesus as the Son of God (John 8:24), repent of your sins (Acts 17:30), confess Jesus Christ (Romans 10:9-10), and be immersed in water for the forgiveness of your sins (Acts 2:38). It is only at this point that you can come into contact with the precious blood of Jesus Christ and experience its great blessings! Then, God requires that you live faithful to Him throughout your life in order to be saved eternally (Revelation 2:10).

Yet, though God has required you to do these things in obedience to Him, you do not and cannot

save yourself! The only way doing these things offers you eternal salvation is through the blood of Jesus Christ. Therefore, we all must recognize and declare, "My life is in His blood"!

Life Is In The Blood

Blood is essential to having life (both physical and spiritual). This is truth that is so subtle, yet powerful. And, it is a core truth that the entire Bible story builds upon.

A general truth

Under the Old Testament Law of sacrifices and offerings, consider what is stated in Leviticus 17:10-12. "And whatever man of the house of Israel, or of the strangers who dwell among you, who eats any blood, I will set My face against that person who eats blood, and will cut him off from among his people. For the life of the flesh is in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it is the blood that makes atonement for the soul.' Therefore I said to the children of Israel, 'No one among you shall eat blood, nor shall any stranger who dwells among you eat blood."

Consider two points from this passage. First, the truth that life is in the blood is established in this passage. Verse 14 also says that blood "is the life of all flesh" and "sustains life." From a scientific perspective, this is a somewhat recent discovery. Up until around the 19th century, "bloodletting" (bleeding) was a fairly common practice – as doctors believed that they could remove impurities from the body through bleeding a patient. However, it is now recognized that this practice is generally harmful rather than helpful. In fact, it is closely linked with George Washington's death. Yet, while modern science has just recently begun to appreciate the life that is in the blood, God's word declared such thousands of years ago in Leviticus 17!

Second, because life is in the blood, blood was not to be eaten. Before an animal could be eaten, God required that its blood be poured out (also see Leviticus 17:13-14). But, please appreciate that this was not just a command that was applicable under the Law of Moses. Instead, this commandment (that was based on the truth that life is in the blood) was also given to Noah and is given to us. In Genesis 9:4, God told Noah, "But you shall not eat flesh with its life, that is,

its blood." And, in the New Testament, we are instructed to abstain from "things strangled, and from blood" (Acts 15:20).

My spiritual life is in Jesus' blood

So, this truth can be plainly observed throughout the pages of the Scriptures. But, physical life is not the only thing that resides in blood. Even more significantly, there is a connection between blood and our spiritual life that can be found in the Bible.

To understand the connection between blood and our spiritual life, we must first understand that God is completely holy (separated from everything that is evil). Therefore, God cannot be in fellowship with anything or anyone wicked. This is why our sin separates us from God (see Isaiah 59:1-2). In order for the sinner to be made right with God, God's justice demands payment for sin. This payment is death. Hebrews 9:22 says, "And according to the law almost all things are purified with blood, and without shedding of blood there is no remission."

Under the Old Testament (prior to the coming of Jesus Christ), God required the Israelites to offer animal sacrifices for their sins. Yet, there was a problem with these animal sacrifices. They were not able (not powerful enough) to forgive sins. Listen to Hebrews 10:1-4 concerning these animal sacrifices. "For the law, having a shadow of the good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with these same sacrifices, which they offer continually year by year, make those who approach perfect. For then would they not have ceased to be offered? For the worshipers, once purified, would have had no more consciousness of sins. But in those sacrifices there is a reminder of sins every year. For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and goats could take away sins."

While God's justice demands the payment of life, God's mercy desires to give all people the opportunity to be saved from their sins and has made the only sacrifice that was capable of truly offering forgiveness from sin – the sacrifice of His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ! Instead of continuing to offer to God the blood of bulls and goats which could never take away our sins, Jesus Christ has been put forward by God "as a propitiation [sacrifice of atonement] by His blood" (Romans 3:25). So, it is through Jesus' blood that we can find mercy from God!

Consider Jesus' words in John 6:53-54. "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you have no life in you. Whoever eats My flesh and drinks My blood has

eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day." Surely, Jesus was not talking about a literal eating and drinking of His flesh and blood (such was both impossible and contrary to what we have already considered). Instead, Jesus is teaching the importance of partaking in Him and being joined together with Him. For instance, those who become Christians have been given the responsibility to partake of the Lord's Supper in remembrance of Him (see Matthew 26:26-29). In this, the unleavened bread represents Jesus' body which was broken for us and the fruit of the vine represents the blood Jesus shed. These are only representative of Jesus' body and blood. But, the Christian has been joined together with Jesus Christ and, according to John 6:53-54, experiences the eternal life that is in the blood of Jesus!

The shedding of Jesus' blood

Before we go on to consider more about the spiritual implications Jesus' blood has upon eternal life, we ought to consider the blood that Jesus shed. As we do, it is important to understand that Jesus Christ (as the Son of God) did not have to come to this earth. Instead, He willingly chose to leave Heaven and come to this earth so that we could have the opportunity to be saved eternally (see 2 Corinthians 8:9 and John 10:10). So, as was prophesied concerning Jesus Christ, He was led as a sheep to the slaughter (see Isaiah 53), "wounded for our transgressions," and "bruised for our iniquities" so that we could be spiritually healed by His stripes!

Let's focus, then, on when Jesus shed His blood. First, Jesus shed His blood prior to the cross. On multiple occasions, the Scriptures reveal that Jesus was severely mistreated after being arrested by His enemies. For instance, in Matthew 27:29, the Bible records that the soldiers twisted a crown of thorns and put it on His head. Surely, this was designed to inflict pain and would have drawn blood. And, after Jesus was sentenced by the Jewish people (with the permission of Pontius Pilate, the Roman governor of Judea) to crucifixion, Matthew 27:26 says, "Then he released Barabbas to them; and when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered Him to be crucified" (also see John 19:1) Consider, for a moment, the Roman practice of scourging. This was a most brutal form of punishment that many did not live through. The prisoner would be tied to a post or frame and stripped of his clothing. Then, he would be beaten (primarily on the back and the loins, but sometimes on the face. The whip would typically be made of several leather strands that would have pieces of bone or metal woven into it. So, this

would do much more than just leave welts. This would tear at the flesh, inflict severe pain, break open the skin, and even was capable of exposing internal parts of the body. Surely, Jesus shed blood when He was scourged.

Second, Jesus shed His blood at the time of His crucifixion. John 19:18 says that they crucified Jesus. This was the cruelest way that the Romans had used to put their worst prisoners to death. In the case of Jesus, He would have been laid on the cross and had nails (large spikes) driven through His hands and His feet (see John 20:25) to affix Him to the cross. The cross would have then been stood upright and dropped into the ground, leaving the weight of Jesus' body to be bore by these nails. Then, after shedding His blood upon the cross and dying, one of the Roman soldiers pierced Jesus' side, and blood and water came out (see John 19:31-37).

Thus, rather than the need for people to continue offering animal sacrifices that could never take away sins, God sent His only begotten Son to this earth as the perfect sacrificial Lamb, offering atonement for the sins of the people. Hebrews 10:11-14 explains: "And every priest stands ministering daily and offering repeatedly the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins. But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down at the right hand of God, from that time waiting till His enemies are made His footstool. For by one offering He has perfected forever those who are being sanctified."

Justified By His Blood

Now, having seen that God has provided this perfect sacrifice by Jesus Christ, let's begin to more fully appreciate what the blood of Jesus Christ means for each one of us. The Scriptures clearly demonstrate that I can be justified by the blood of Jesus Christ!

Without Jesus' blood

Without Jesus' blood I am a lawbreaker on the run. But, I know that I will eventually be caught and sentenced for the sins that I have committed. Since God sees everything (Proverbs 15:3) and will judge the world one Day by Jesus Christ (2 Corinthians 5:10), it is only a matter of time before I will experience the eternal consequences for the sins I have committed. I will surely be made to suffer eternally in Hell fire, the

place that is depicted as a lake burning with fire and brimstone (Revelation 21:8).

And, without Jesus' blood, I have no way of escaping these consequences. Whenever I have committed sin, I incurred a spiritual debt that was greater than I could ever repay by myself (as pictured by Jesus' parable in Matthew 18:21-35). I could spend the rest of my life doing nothing besides that which was good, but I simply could not ever do enough to take away the debt of sin that I have brought upon myself – even if I have only sinned one time!

With Jesus' blood

But, with Jesus' blood I can be justified! Romans 5:8-9 says, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him." To be "justified" is to be made right in God's sight. It is to be cleansed from the sins that I had been guilty of. Thus, I am spiritually healed and made "just-if-I'd" never sinned against God!

Revelation 1:5 pictures Jesus' blood as washing us from our sins. 1 John 1:7 says that "the blood of Jesus Christ...cleanses us from all sin." So, no matter what sins I have committed (as all sin is equal in God's sight), I am made pure and free from them all through the blood of Jesus Christ!

2 Corinthians 5:21 says, "For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him." God offered Jesus Christ (who committed no sin, see Hebrews 4:15) as the sacrifice for the sins of the world. That is, Jesus Christ shed His blood in order to meet the penalty for sin – not for His own sins, but for my sins (and for the sins of all mankind). This was done in order that we could be declared righteous in God's sight.

Now, please recognize that I could never have been declared righteous in God's sight (right with God) after I had sinned – apart from Jesus' blood. I would have forever been a lawbreaker. Yet, God "condemned sin in the flesh, that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit" (Romans 8:3-4). He fulfilled the requirement to be righteous through Jesus Christ. Now, if I will live my life for Him and separate myself from the ways of sin, I can be right with God.

Thus, the spiritual debt that I could never repay has been paid by Jesus' blood. As the parable in Matthew 18:21-35 indicates, this debt is entirely forgiven. Through Jesus' blood, I am debt free (so long as I live my life for Him)! All of the past sins that I have committed in my life are entirely forgotten by God. I no longer stand guilty before God for the sins I have previously committed. They have all been washed away by the blood of Jesus Christ and God no longer sees them in my life!

Redeemed By His Blood

By Jesus' blood, I am made right in the sight of God, just as if I had never sinned against Him. But, this is not all the blood of Jesus Christ has made possible. The Scriptures also clearly demonstrate that I can be redeemed by the blood of Jesus Christ!

Without Jesus' blood

Without Jesus' blood, I am a child of Satan. Whenever I chose to violate God's laws and live to fulfill my own physical desires, I obeyed the desires of Satan rather than the desires of God. Thus, I was a child of the devil/Satan. For instance, listen to what Jesus told individuals who were living in sin, in John 8:44. "You are of your father the devil, and the desires of your father you want to do. He was a murderer from the beginning, and does not stand in the truth, because there is no truth in him. When he speaks a lie, he speaks from his own resources, for he is a liar and the father of it." 1 John 3:10 also indicates that those who do not "practice righteousness" or love is a child of the devil. So, at one time, I was a child of the devil because I was living according to the desires of the devil rather than the desires of God.

Without Jesus' blood, I am, therefore, also enslaved to Satan (sin). I presented the members of my physical body to obey the ways of sin rather than the ways that were pleasing to God. Whenever I did this, I became the slave of sin (see Romans 6:15-23). But, little did I know at that time just how hard a master sin actually is. For, sin (though it offers some temporary physical pleasures) often results in many hardships physically – and will certainly result in an eternity of suffering spiritually. For, when I was a slave to sin, it was certainly going to result in eternal spiritual death (Romans 6:21). Then, even more, I could never escape this slavery to sin by myself! Once I had committed sin,

I was forever enslaved to sin – without the blood of Jesus.

With Jesus' blood

But, with Jesus' blood, I can be redeemed! Ephesians 1:7 says, "In Him [Jesus Christ] we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace." To be "redeemed" is to be ransomed. So, I was enslaved to sin. I was trapped. There was no way out of this slavery that I could accomplish by myself. The price of my freedom from sin was greater than I could ever pay. But, Someone paid it for me – and that Someone was Jesus Christ!

Only now can I be free from slavery to sin and enslaved to God in righteousness (again see Romans 6:15-23). I have went from being a child of a father (in Satan) who hated, deceived, manipulated, and spiritually abused me to being an adopted child of a Father (in God, see Romans 8:14-17) who loved me enough to sacrifice His only begotten Son to die on the cross for me so that I could be saved from my sins. Thus, I have exchanged masters. I have been freed from a hard master and placed under the care of a great and loving Master!

But, what was the purchase price? How could I possibly be ransomed from the sins that I had committed against God? The only thing that could accomplish this was the blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Once again, Ephesians 1:7 says that the redemption is "through His blood." Listen to 1 Peter 1:18-19. It says, "knowing that you were not redeemed with corruptible things, like silver or gold, from your aimless conduct received by tradition from your fathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot."

No amount of silver or gold (or any other physical thing) could possibly be enough to ransom us from our slavery to sin. Only Jesus' blood was capable of accomplishing such. Listen to the language of Colossians 1:13-14 (considering that those in sin have been trapped in Satan's kingdom). "He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins."

Now, by Jesus' blood, I have the opportunity to be part of Jesus' kingdom (His church). Unlike Satan's kingdom, Jesus' kingdom offers freedom from the consequences of sin and everlasting life in Heaven. Acts 20:28 says that God has "purchased" the church

(His saved people, His kingdom) "with His own blood." And, Hebrews 9:12 (in a picture that draws our minds back to the Jewish system of animal sacrifices) says that Jesus has entered the "Most Holy Place once for all" (the innermost part of the tabernacle and temple where the sin offering would be brought once each year to make atonement for the sins of the people) "with His own blood." And, this one-time sacrifice was enough to obtain for us "eternal redemption"!

Reconciled To God By His Blood

By Jesus' blood, I am made right in the sight of God and redeemed/purchased from slavery to sin. But, this is not all the blood of Jesus Christ has made possible. The Scriptures also clearly demonstrate that I can be reconciled to God by the blood of Jesus Christ!

Without Jesus' blood

Without Jesus' blood, as we have already discussed, I am spiritually dead. Even while I am living, I am dead spiritually (1 Timothy 5:6). This is the wages of my sin (Romans 1:32 and Romans 6:23). But, exactly what does it mean to be spiritually "dead"? This is a reference to spiritual separation from God. Isaiah 59:1-2 says, "Behold, the Lord's hand is not shortened, That it cannot save; Nor His ear heavy, That it cannot hear. But your iniquities have separated you from your God; And your sins have hidden His face from you, So that He will not hear." So, it is not that God wants me to be separated from Him. Instead, since God is perfectly holy (as separated from evil as light is separated from darkness, see 1 John 1:5), this means that whenever I commit sin (the works of darkness), I separate myself from Him (see 1 John 1:6). I cannot be in fellowship with Him.

Without Jesus' blood, then, I am separated from every spiritual blessing that God offers to those who are in fellowship with Him. Though God still blesses those who are wicked with good things physically (see Matthew 5:45 and Romans 2:4), He reserves the spiritual blessings for those who are in fellowship with Him. So, without Jesus' blood, I have no hope of any kind of relationship with God and spiritual blessings – because I have separated myself from God. This means that as I live on this earth in my sin, I have no hope beyond any of the temporary things that are associated with life on earth.

With Jesus' blood

But, with Jesus' blood, I can be reconciled to God! 2 Corinthians 5:18-19 says, "Now all things are of God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Jesus Christ...that God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself, not imputing their trespasses to them...." To "reconcile" refers to the practice of exchanging. Particularly, you might consider how one type of currency might be reconciled to another. The equal amount of new currency would be exchanged for the old. But, without Christ, I could never have had enough to offer God in exchange for fellowship with Him. Thanks be to God that He chose to reconcile mankind to Himself through Jesus Christ! Only Jesus' blood could provide an "even exchange" to be in fellowship with God once again!

Colossians 1:19-23 says, "For it pleased the Father that in Him all the fullness should dwell, and by Him to reconcile all things to Himself, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross. And you, who once were alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked works, yet now He has reconciled in the body of His flesh through death, to present you holy, and blameless, and above reproach in His sight—if indeed you continue in the faith, grounded and steadfast, and are not moved away from the hope of the gospel which you heard, which was preached to every creature under heaven, of which I, Paul, became a minister."

God was pleased (because of His great love, mercy, and grace) to offer Jesus Christ, so that I could be reconciled to God by His blood. Thus, I can now be at peace with God rather than forever being separated from Him. Even though I was His enemy (when I was in my sins), I can now be reconciled to Him by the blood of Jesus and I can be declared holy and blameless in the sight of God – just as God is holy and blameless!

Thus, although I was without hope while I was living in this world separated from God in my sins, Ephesians 2:11-13 says that "now in Christ Jesus" though I was "once...far off" from God, I have been "brought near by the blood of Christ." Now, I can have a direct relationship with God because my sins have been forgiven (I have been justified) and I have access to every spiritual blessing God has made available in Christ Jesus (see Ephesians 1:3).

In fact, now that Jesus Christ has sacrificed Himself, I can have "boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus" (Hebrews 10:19). Under the Old

Testament system of sacrifices, only the High Priest could enter the Most Holy Place (the innermost part of the tabernacle and temple), and he only did so once per year with the sin offering. This is where God would meet with the people upon the mercy seat. But, by the blood of Jesus Christ, I can have boldness to enter this place (rather than with timidity and apprehension). This indicates the opportunity I have to have a relationship and fellowship with God. I am not separated from Him any longer! I now have an unrestricted fellowship with Him through the blood of Jesus Christ!

Saved From The Wrath Of God By His Blood

By Jesus' blood, I am made right in the sight of God, redeemed/purchased from slavery to sin, and reconciled to God. But, this is not all the blood of Jesus Christ has made possible. The Scriptures also clearly demonstrate that I can be saved from the wrath of God by the blood of Jesus Christ!

Without Jesus' blood

Without Jesus' blood, I was the enemy of God. As we have already considered, I was separated from God in my sin. The Scriptures directly present this condition as being hostile toward God. James 4:4 says, "Adulterers and adulteresses! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Whoever therefore wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God." To be a friend of the world is to live according to the wicked ways of the world. 1 John 2:15-17 says that the ways of the world are all contrary to the ways of God. Therefore, whenever I sinned against God (even one time), I made myself His enemy by working contrary to His holy ways.

Without Jesus' blood, I was to be punished as God will punish His enemies. The Scriptures are filled with examples that demonstrate the fact that God's enemies will always be defeated. For instance, whenever God decided to punish the nations that sinned against Him during Old Testament times, they could not overpower Him so as to be victorious against God. Today, God has promised that those who are His enemies will be eternally punished in Hell fire. They will experience the wrath of God. 2 Thessalonians 1:8-9, for instance, says that when Jesus returns from

Heaven with His mighty angels, He will be, "in flaming fire, taking vengeance on those who do not know God, and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. These shall be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power." Yes, in the everlasting torment of Hell fire, God will show His vengeance toward those who die in their sin.

With Jesus' blood

But, with Jesus' blood, I can be saved from the wrath of God! Romans 5:8-11 says, "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him. For if when we were enemies we were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life. And not only that, but we also rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received the reconciliation."

If Jesus' blood has been applied to my life and I am living faithfully for Him whenever He returns, God will pass over the sentence of condemnation I deserve to experience because of my sins! This is because I have been justified and reconciled to God. Thus, what I have been saved from is the punishment I deserved to experience. This is the punishment of spending eternity in Hell with the devil and his angels, where the fire is never quenched and there is great pain and anguish.

Instead of experiencing the wrath of God that I deserve to experience, Jesus' blood has given me the opportunity to live eternally with God in Heaven (in the place that is free from all pain, sorrow, anguish, death, and evil – and the place where God and Jesus will also live forever)! John 3:16 summarizes this same point: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

Thus, in Jesus Christ (by His precious blood), I have the opportunity to not perish and suffer eternally as the result of the sins I have committed against God – and I can be saved eternally in Heaven. Then, not only must I appreciate that I have this opportunity through the blood of Jesus Christ, but, it is *only* through the blood of Jesus Christ that I can be saved!

Conclusion

Without the blood of Jesus Christ, I am nothing. I am doomed to everlasting destruction. I am hopelessly separated from God. All because I have sinned against Him. "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 6:23).

Thanks be to God that He sent Jesus Christ to this earth to offer Himself as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world. It is through Him that I am saved from God's wrath, reconciled to God, redeemed from my sins, and justified in God's sight! In addition, it was Jesus' blood that brought in the New Covenant that I now enjoy the blessings of (see Matthew 26:28). This new covenant centers around the opportunity that God would remember the sins of those who come to Him no more (see Hebrews 8:12)! It is, therefore, the perfect law of liberty (that offers freedom from sin, James 1:25).

Still, if I desire to partake of all the wonderful blessings God has made available through the blood of Jesus Christ, I must be obedient to Him. Yes, Jesus' blood has been "shed for many for the remission of sins" (Matthew 26:28). He died for everyone. Yet, most will still be forever lost in their sins because they will not live their lives according to God's word (see Matthew 7:13-14)!

It is only those who are obedient to the gospel of Jesus Christ who will overcome the devil and his works "by the blood of the Lamb" (Revelation 12:11)! There is power in His blood and victory over sin and death through Him! Won't you come to Jesus today and abide in Him so that your sins can be washed in His blood?
